IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS

47,840 total lives impacted by Employee & Family Resources in 2023!

9,870 students and family members were served by the Student Assistance Program through assessment, referral and brief counseling sessions and student groups.

17,887 individuals from more than 400 companies across the nation received support through EFR's Employee Assistance Program.

359 individuals received counseling to help address mental health and substance abuse issues.



17,630 Central lowans (youth and adults) were served by EFR's substance abuse and problem gambling prevention specialists.

2,094 Central lowans received substance abuse assessment and referral services, providing an opportunity for recovery to people struggling with substance abuse and other related issues.



Emily is a young girl whose days were once overshadowed by sudden, overwhelming panic attacks, her internal distress spilling into the classrooms. A concerned teacher's gentle nudge led her to open the door to EFR's SAP services.

At first, Emily was hesitant, her difficulty expressing and regulating emotions creating an invisible barrier to therapy. Through the SAP and the compassionate guidance of an EFR counselor, Emily utilized her SAP sessions and transitioned into outpatient therapy.

With each session, Emily gained newfound skills to manage her anxiety and began the delicate work of opening up the channels of communication with her loved ones. Her growth was marked by milestones—panic attacks ceased to disrupt her school life, and dialogues about her emotional world started to flow at home and with friends.

Emily's story is a beacon of hope, illustrating the profound change that EFR's counseling services can catalyze. Her narrative is one of countless others that underscore our commitment to empowering youth, one conversation, one coping strategy, one session at a time.

Student Assistance Program

The Student Assistance Program continued its growth trajectory in FY23!

The program welcomed nine new school districts to the program and added onsite SAP services in two school districts. Our dedicated program staff reached almost 10,000 students and family members through program orientations, group services, and SAP counseling.

The team also continued to seek creative avenues to engage students and their families. From collaborating with activity directors and establishing a strong presence at open houses and mental health awareness events, to rolling out a digital toolbox allowing school districts to easily incorporate SAP details in their digital communications; the team remains dedicated to ensuring families stay informed and engaged.

Counseling

EFR's Mental Health Counseling Program team is proud to be helping so many people in the community. In 2023, they connected with 359 clients and provided 3,016 outpatient sessions—a remarkable increase of over 400 sessions compared to the previous year!

Thanks to the generous contributions of our EFR donors, we offered a lifeline to 32 low-income clients, facilitating access to vital mental health counseling on a sliding fee scale.

The counseling team expanded this year with the addition of a school psychologist. This expertise allowed us to offer testing and diagnosis for conditions such as ADHD, autism, and learning disorders, including dyslexia. These offerings have proven invaluable, especially for clients facing long wait times or unaffordable fees elsewhere. Our team remains committed to serving the community, ensuring everyone receives the care they deserve.

Prevention

It was another stellar year for EFR's Prevention Team! They achieved 100% of their outcomes associated with 12 different work plans, touching the lives of over 17,630 individuals in Polk, Warren, Jasper, and Marion counties.

Their digital outreach efforts soared with an impressive 27,460 social media impressions from Polk County residents for their opioid overdose prevention toolkit.

Through the team's dedicated efforts, we've provided early childhood education to approximately 2,500 children, engaged 450 high-risk youth in Polk County with diversion and substance abuse prevention programs, and implemented six gambling policy changes to increase awareness of problem gambling.

Maria

Maria, a 7th grader from a quiet rural town, reached out to an EFR Student Assistance Program (SAP) counselor seeking someone who would genuinely hear her struggles. Overwhelmed by mental health challenges, Maria felt invisible and unheard, even as she bravely voiced her need for hospitalization.

Recognizing the severity of her plea, the SAP counselor immediately acted, bridging the gap between Maria's silent battles and the help she desperately needed. The counselor's assessment, advocacy, and collaboration with her parents led to Maria receiving inpatient hospital care, marking the beginning of her healing.

One month later, Maria returned to school and embarked on a journey of recovery with her SAP counselor. Over the following months, Maria and her counselor crafted a toolkit of positive coping strategies, explored methods to recognize and challenge negative thoughts, and helped Maria identify her inner strengths.

By her final session, Maria emerged with a robust set of coping strategies, a blossoming self-confidence, and a bright vision for her future. In her last session, Maria reflected on the pivotal role her SAP counselor played by **validating her voice and empowering her self-advocacy—a gift that Maria will carry forward as she confidently steps into her future.**

Employee Assistance Program

The EAP touched the lives of 17,887 employees and their families through its diversity of services — from counseling and life coaching to legal and financial consultation to educational training and webinars. With the additional partnerships of 94 new companies during 2023, we've expanded our reach, making the EAP's valuable resources available to 48,000 new employees and their families

As part of our commitment to fostering workplace mental wellbeing, we provided three specialized training sessions for EAP company managers at no additional cost, successfully educating 1,400 leaders across 73 sessions. A notable highlight from May is the introduction of Togetherall, a comprehensive, anonymous online peer support community that includes a wealth of resources to support mental health, complementing our existing professional services like counseling and coaching!

Substance Abuse Services

EFR's Substance Abuse Services program had a successful year serving 2,094 clients and ensuring those in our community receive vital access to substance abuse treatment.

Notably, 90% of those served are among the most economically challenged in our community, living on incomes below 200% of the federal poverty level. Most have some involvement with the criminal justice system. Our SAS team is committed to championing the cause of this underserved and vulnerable population. Recognizing the need for clear communication, we've overhauled our approach to ensure our services and paperwork are accessible in the client's first language.

In addition, we've strengthened our lines of communication with key stakeholders such as attorneys and probation officers. This concerted effort ensures every client is presented with the best opportunity to access timely and effective treatment programs when appropriate.




